

The Santa Fe Texas Education Foundation has raised more per student than most public school foundations in Texas. According to Education Capital, a firm specializing in education foundation research, the state-wide average raised per student was \$17.50.**

<i>Keith's Anti-bullying Assemblies</i>	<p>A total of 9 assemblies, including a public presentation for parents, took place in the Fall of 2014. All students, across all campuses learned bully prevention strategies.</p> <p>"It has been almost a week now since the assemblies and students are still talking about the assembly. <i>Lighting for All-District Musical</i> 	<p>For 4 years in a row, SFISD students have produced an all-district musical each spring semester. 



Some of the topics covered were: effective communication skills, how to handle disruptive students, empowering students to self-manage their own behavior, and much more.</p> <p>In the near future, there will be more SFHS faculty and staff participation.</p>

Science in the Movies Traveling Show	<p>On March 6, many high school students in chemistry and Integrated Physics and Chemistry courses will learn about the science behind movie stunts and special effects.</p>
FIRST Robotics Competition Sponsored by 	<p>FIRST Robotics is a nation-wide program where students build robots and compete against other students. This is the first year our SFHS students have participated, and without this extra funding, it would not be possible. The Foundation also arranged for Boeing engineers to assist our students. Interest in this program is growing among students.</p>


Project Title	Impact
<i>Around the World from SFJH</i>	286 books and ebooks have been purchased and used by students this school year. In May, 6th grade social studies students will participate in a world fair project.
<i>Battle of the Books 2015</i>	2014 Battle of the Books was a huge success. Numerous copies of 31 new books are now available for our jr. high students. Later in the year, 2015 Battle of the Books trivia competition will take place, featuring judges from the Foundation board.
<i>Doorway to your Future – Career Exploration</i>	Since high school students are now required to choose a career field, the jr. high has launched this project that allows students to learn about careers. To date, students have learned about architecture and construction. Students will continue to learn about more careers throughout this school year, and beyond.
<i>Cross Curriculum Learning Using Chromebooks</i>	Learning can be greatly expanded with updated technology, and our students are craving for more access. With this grant, the jr. high purchased a class set of 30 laptops that are used daily.
<i>Lavaliere Microphones for SFJH</i>	It can be difficult to keep large groups engaged. This project funded 12 microphones that have been used for large presentations. Students are using them, and they have also learned proper care and storage.
<i>National History Day Fair</i>	Over 200 students entered the History Fair and 53 students qualified for the regional level. The students are developing important research, interpretive, and writing skills.
<i>Chemistry 101 (eBooks)</i>	Students now have access to eBooks that focus on chemistry and periodic table. These eBooks can be checked out on student's phones. So even students without internet access at home are better able to complete their science assignments.








